I enclose a copy of a Plan
forwarded to W. Davis to sign. As I have put his
separate Plans together which were made for
each particular Settler, I have found some mistakes
which I have rectified. By next post I will
send the descriptions to be put into each deed
and recommend the deeds being sent on directly.
I see no prospect of a quiet
settlement, under the late act. The Settlers do
not approve, and will not be content if it is
used; it therefore behoves the Proprietors to give
a substitute, while they have the power of giving
it in their own form. My own opinion is if this
law is considered as the medium of settlement.
