Head Quarters 12th Regt Me Vols New Orleans Oct 7th 1862

I respectfully pray for the release of the following persons, now in the Parish Prison, at New Orleans, members of the 12th Me Vols for the reason that I believe them to be there in violation of Law and that they are guilty of no offenses

for which they should ^ degraded by confinement with Murderers & Pick-pockets – Most of them were sent there "until released by order of their Regimental Commander." I have respectfully ordered their release, but my order is not observed by the Prison Keeper –
