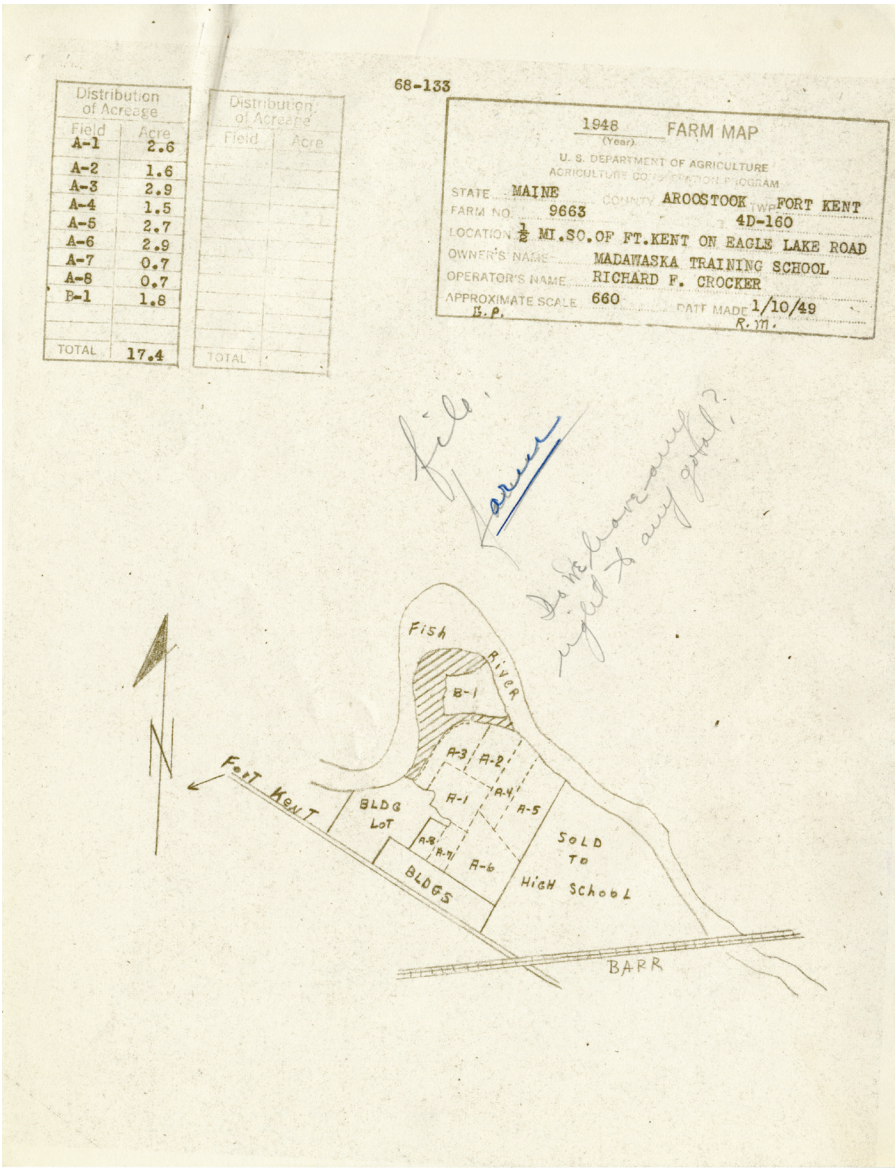

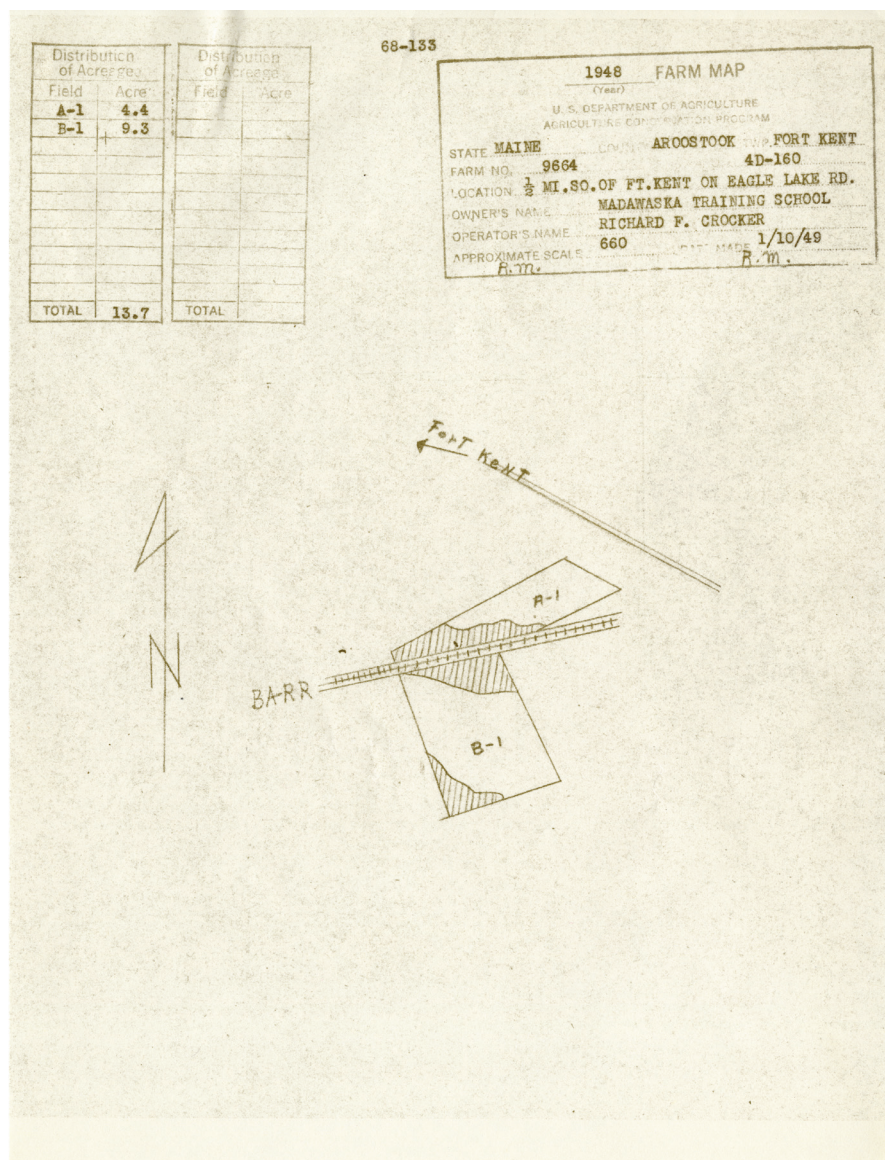

Farms will be checked on planted acreage. If some of the acreage is drowned out or destroyed, it will be necessary to count this acreage unless it is harrowed out before the farm is checked.

Farm checking will begin late in June. It is the privilege of any grower to decide whether he stays within his goal or not, but if he decides to stay in, he should take the necessary steps to make sure that he does not plant over. Program regulations definitely state that if a grower's acreage is more than his goal, he is out of the Program whether it is by mistake or not. In the past, it has caused some disappointment to growers and plenty of headaches to the County Committee.

If entire fields, as shown on the farm map, are planted to potatoes, deductions for headlands may be made from the acreage shown to determine the actual acres of potatoes planted in the field.
