



Farms will be checked on planted acreage. If some of the acreage is drowned out or destroyed, it will be necessary to count this acreage unless it is harrowed out before the farm is checked.

Farm checking will begin late in June. It is the priwilege of any grower to decide whether he stays within his goal
or not, but if he decides to stay in, he should take the necessary
steps to make sure that he does not plant over. Program regulations definitely state that if a grower's acreage is more than his
goal, he is out of the Program whether it is by mistake or not.
