Amy Stevens: Now when there was an accident or something would workers ever take up a collection for the injured person or the family or anything like that ever happen?

Arthur Verow: Yes they would. I know they would. There was always somebody loaning somebody some money or giving up overtime to someone that needed the money, that kind of thing. There were, of course if you worked Sunday you get double time, double pay and there were certain people that just refused to work on Sunday, you know but then there were other people right there ready to take on the job. When we had a few snow storms I remember that a lot of people couldn't get into work so I remember a couple of guys worked 24 hours which was against the law back then too. They would have to send them home, saying you can't stay here but yet we need somebody, you have to take an hour off, you have to go and come back.
