Rev^d & Dear Brother,

I last evening returned from a journey in the back settlements, where there is a hopeful appearance of religion, and of establishing religious order & —————

I am preparing to journey to Boston, partly to attend to the interest & concerns of the Indians – They will expect to be informed in the Spring whether the Gen^l Court will assist them in agriculture & schooling &

you

I hope, Dear Sir, ^ will make every preparation in your power —

A petition, from a number of influential characters in your vicinity, would be of importance – I hope to see you, between 2 & 3 weeks from this– If you can devise – and make any arrangements in the mean time, I hope, & believe you will – And am in much

haste – in sentiments of the most cordial esteem, yours in the Gospel-
