


Iron roofing on house good. Shingles on barn poor, paint good.

A certain lot or parcel of land with the buildings thereon situated in said Bridgton a part of lot numbered seven in the thirteenth range of lots in said Town bounded and described as follows:--, to wit.: Commencing on the Southerly side of the road leading through Bridgton Center Village to Long Pond, so called, at the corner of land now owned by Edward R. Staples, a stone post-thence running Westerly by the road aforesaid four (4) rods and fifteen (15) links to an iron hub driven into the ground; thence South about forty-three(43) degrees and thirty (30) minutes West nineteen and three fourths (1920) rods to a stone post, and land to David C. Saunders; thence South forty-three (43) degrees and thirty (30) minutes East by land of said Saundersband same course, three and one half(3½) rods to land of John S. Winn; thence Northerly by land of said Winn and land of Frank L. Ealexander and land of Edward R. Steples to the stone post begun at and bound first mentioned. And is the same premises which was conveyed to me the said Sylvester R. Carsley by deed of Warranty from Royal Senter dated December 26th.A. D. 1865 and recorded in Cumberland County Registry of Deeds Book, 339, Page 203, to which deed and record and to deer and record therein is referred to, reference is to be had for succession of title and for
