


A lot or parcel of land with the buildings thereon situated on the south side of Main Street, so called, being a part of lot #7 in the 13th range and bounded as follows: Commence at an iron pipe on, or near to, the southerly line of said Street and at a point easterly distant,  $97\frac{1}{2}$  feet from the northeasterly corner, of said street, on the Joseph L. Wales Homestead Lot, now owned by Fred S. Hanson, thence run south 15 degrees west, 186 feet and 6 inches to an iron pipe driven into the ground, which said pipe stands  $52\frac{1}{2}$  feet, on a course bearing south  $1\frac{1}{2}$  degrees east, from the southeasterly corner of the barn on the Old Scribner Homestead Lot, and 33 feet, on the course bearing south 82 degrees and 30 minutes west, from the northeasterly corner of the Engine House of Bridgton Center Village Corporation, thence run south 75 degrees east, to a point on the westerly or back line of said Corporation Engine House Lot, thence first northerly, thence easterly, by the line of said Engine House Lot, to the Street or way leading from Maine Street, southerly
