


A lot or parcel of land with the buildings thereon situated on Main Street the same being a Garage known as the W. S. Fox Property on the Southerly side of Pondicherry Square, bounded: Commencing at a point on the southerly side of Main Street, being the northerly end of a line parallel with the westerly foundation wall of the W. S. Fox Garage, so called, and 18 inches westerly therefrom projected to Main Street, running thence southerly along said line parallel with the westerly line of the foundation wall of the said Fox and 18 inches distant westerly therefrom to Stevens Brook, thence easterly along Stevens Brook to Portland Street, thence northerly along Portland Street to Main Street, thence westerly along Main Street to the point begun at, it being the intention to include in said parcel all the premises formerly owned in common and undivided by Guy W. Adams and W. S. Fox, easterly of the line parallel with the westerly foundation wall of the Fox Garage and 18 inches westerly therefrom so that the parcel hereby conveyed will be bounded on the west by said line above described, on the east by Portland Street, on the South by Stevens Brook.
