Description: Simeon Malone of Portland wrote to Mr. Evans of the Sanitary Commission, acknowledging receipt of his letter about the death of Malone's brother.

## Portland Maine April 20th

1865

Mr Evans Dear Friend I received your letter

of the fifteenth which brought me the sad intelligance of my brothers death the news was hard for me and my mother to hear but we all feel very greatful to you for your kindness in giveing us the information you have and we tender you our thanks for if my you had not written to us I dont know as we would have ever known where he was or what had become of him but I thought that it was very strange that I did not hear from him if he was alive you can imagine our feelings when we read that sad new sand the thoughts that our beloved brother should be thus taken away from us as the dawn of peace had come after all the battles that he went through that he should now be taken down by the hand of a traitor is almost to much to stand under but such is the case and nothing will bring his life back again but may I ask a favor of you in behalf of my dear mother and sisters who deeply mourn the loss of their brother and her son is it possible for you to mark the spot where my brother fell or where he was burried

if it is will you do it? will you be so kind to us as to try and find him and his whereabouts that he lys if I could get through the lines I would come and try and find him but I supose it will be impossiable for me to get through the lines I ask this favor please tell me how far from

Panpose you sannot answer also tell me what Balle hewar Killed in you say it was about two miles from a anaville Layon but what the name of the fall was youdid nottle me but I amasking to much off you you have been soking already to me that I aming eatful to ask so many questions of you will you try and assertain whether it will be possible forme to get through the lines als you think you could get me through if you do I will come I would know you my bother if he had been burried Six month by his lame foot and I could find him if he was amoning ten thousand but if you will be so kind if it is possiable for you to find him and mark the shot I will hap you well for it and brides
that you will be bestowing a great blessing whomle
for beserved mother sho was bound up in the wart of her
belned son please write as soon as you get this and you will

I will write again soon for I want to find out all the particulars pertaining to his death and I hope you will give me all the information you can do you know any one else that belonged to he same company that would be likely to know where he fell if you do please tell them to write to me I will send any one all the paper they want and pay them well no more at present direct in
