Nothing decisive has taken place, my Betsey,
 since my last, we have frequent Skirmishing
 with the Enemy &c &c but have not time to
 write particulars. have not had the Pleasure to
 hear from you & my little Brother since [missing words]
 Boston; a line from my Dear would be ve[missing words]
 acceptable I'll assure you. Our work [missing words]
 likely to be longer than was represented to us [missing words]
 we set out, as the Enemy are not to be reduce [torn]
 in their Fortress with our present force. We ha [torn]
 given them offerr of Battle repeatedly to draw
 them out of their Works, but have not succeeded;

we mean to try them again in the Same in
 afternoon. The Harmony between the Fleet &
 Army is not a perfect Unison. Am in good
 Health & am, my love, yours sincerely. Adieu
